

James D. Brogan Memorial Scholarship

James D. Brogan graduated from St. Norbert High School in DePere and the University of Wisconsin Madison with a degree in political science. He began his professional career with the Bay Lakes Council of the Boy Scouts of America, and in 1972, he and his brother John Brogan acquired the Bank of Kaukauna. Jim served as the bank Chief Executive Officer for over thirty years. He was passionately committed to secondary education and to the city of Kaukauna. He supported education for its own sake and encouraged those around him to pursue it. On many occasions, he personally supported the education of individuals out of his own resources. This scholarship was established, in memory of Jim, due to his love of learning and the city of Kaukauna.



Eligibility:

Graduating seniors from Kaukauna High School pursing higher education at a 4-year college or university. Applicants must be an account holder at the Bank of Kaukauna. (Minors will need an adult with them to open an account.) The ideal candidate will be a student who has:

- Achieved academic excellence
- Participated in extracurricular activities
- Participated in volunteerism

Award Amount:

One renewable \$2,000 per year scholarship award for up to 4 years (\$8,000 total) for a student who will be attending a four year college or university.

Selection:

Applicants will fill out the Kaukauna High School Scholarship Application and turn it in to the Kaukauna High School Guidance Office. The applications will then be forwarded to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region for selection by their scholarship selection committee. Recipients will be selected based on the eligibility criteria listed above.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: completed scholarship verification form (located at www.cffoxvalley.org/scholarships) and verification of full time student status (class schedule with credits listed). After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the student will be attending during the first semester of the freshman year of college. For subsequent years the student must submit all of the above documentation along with prior year's grade report (unofficial grade report will suffice). Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email. Please keep us advised of your current email address.

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to maintain full-time student status at a 4-year college or university, with a minimum cumulative 3.0 grade point average.
