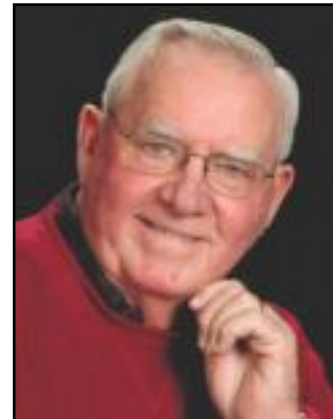


Clintonville Area Foundation Jerry Wagenson Memorial Scholarship



Jerry Wagenson was a very progressive farmer who had a great thirst for knowledge in the agricultural field. Jerry and his wife, Sue, purchased a farm in October of 1979. That farming operation has since grown and is now known as Wagenson Farms. Jerry was very active in his community. He was a member of the board for the local Cooperative, and also participated as a member of the Bear Creek Lions, the National Corn Growers Association, American Soybean Association, WI Soybean Association, WI Corn Growers Association and the National Cattlemen's Association as well as the president of the board for Outagamie Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS).

All three of Jerry and Sue's children graduated from Clintonville High School and were active members of Future Farmers of America (FFA) and 4-H. Two of the children held the office of president of the Clintonville FFA, their daughter being the first female president. One of their sons attended a short course for agriculture at the University of Wisconsin-Madison after he graduated from high school. Jerry and Sue felt it was very important to educate up and coming farmers. Two of their sons, along with Sue, are current partners of the Wagenson Farms, which is something Jerry and Sue were extremely proud of.

Jerry passed away on May 29, 2013. His family wanted to carry on his legacy by establishing the Jerry Wagenson Memorial Scholarship in his memory, which they are sure he would have been very pleased with.

Eligibility:

Graduating senior from Clintonville High School who intends to pursue a degree in an agriculturally related field. The ideal recipient will have demonstrated the following:

- Minimum GPA of 3.0
- Strong interest in agriculture
- Involvement in FFA and/or 4-H preferred

Award Amount:

\$500 non-renewable scholarship award for tuition expenses, to be paid after successful completion of the first semester.

Selection:

Recipients will be recommended each spring by the Clintonville High School Scholarship Selection Committee.

Payment Procedure:

After successful completion of first semester, scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: completed scholarship verification form (located at www.cffoxvalley.org/scholarships), proof of degree program, first semester grade report and verification of full time student status for the second semester of college (class schedule with credits listed). After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending during the second semester of the freshman year of college. This scholarship cannot be deferred. Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email. *Please keep us advised of your current email address.*

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to register as a full-time student for the second semester of college, pursuing a degree in an agriculturally related field, as a student in good standing.
