



Chilton Area Community Foundation Adolph Stoelting Scholarship

Born in 1882, Adolph Stoelting was one of Kiel's pioneer manufacturers. He and his brothers started the Stoelting Brothers Company in Kiel in 1906. Until his death in 1961, at the age of 75, Adolph maintained an interest in the affairs of the company. Today, Stoelting, a Vollrath Company, is a diversified manufacturer of frozen treat equipment, with a reputation for state-of-the-art engineering and uncompromising quality.

Adolph served in several civic jobs, including alderman in 1920 when Kiel was first organized as a city. He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church, Chamber of Commerce and a director of the Citizens State Bank.

Adolph advocated for higher education even though he did not attend college himself. Family members who established this scholarship fund said Adolph was jovial, loving and warm. This scholarship serves as Adolph's way of giving back to the Kiel community.



Eligibility:

Graduating high school seniors from Kiel High School who are pursuing post-secondary education. The following will be taken into consideration to determine recipients:

- Academic achievement
- Financial need
- Leadership
- Character

Award Amount:

Two \$500 non-renewable scholarship awards for tuition expenses. One scholarship will be awarded to a male student and one to a female student.

Selection:

Recipients will be selected each spring by the Adolph Stoelting Scholarship Selection Committee within the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: completed scholarship verification form (located at <u>www.cffoxvalley.org/scholarships</u>), and verification of full time student status (class schedule with credits listed). After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending during the first semester of the freshman year of college. This scholarship cannot be deferred. Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email. *Please keep us advised of your current email address.*

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to register as a full-time student for the first semester of freshman year of college.
