

Albert W. Wuyts and Louise M. Wuyts Scholarship

During their lifetimes, Albert and Louise Wuyts were generous contributors to their churches and their community. Among the benefactors of their generosity was the Kaukauna Fire Department, Kaukauna High School, Peace United Methodist Church, St. Mary of the Annunciation Catholic Church, St. Paul Elder Services and Thousand Islands Environmental Center. In addition, they were instrumental in establishing the Kaukauna High School ghost statue which is prominently displayed in the front of the school. As another lasting token of their legacy, this scholarship fund was established with a bequest gift from their estate to benefit Kaukauna High School seniors pursuing higher education.



Eligibility:

Graduating high school seniors from Kaukauna High School pursuing higher education. The ideal recipients will be students who have:

- Good moral character
- Demonstrate citizenship
- Involvement in extracurricular and community activities
- Maintained a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average.

Award Amount:

One - renewable \$1,500 per year scholarship award for up to 4 years (\$6,000 total) for a student who will be attending a four-year college or university

Two – renewable \$1,000 per year scholarship awards for up to 2 years (\$2,000 total) to students who will be attending a two-year college or vocational/technical college.

Selection:

Selection will be made by the Kaukauna High School Scholarship Selection Committee based on the eligibility criteria listed above.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: completed scholarship verification form (located at www.cffoxvalley.org/scholarships) and verification of full time student status (class schedule with credits listed). After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the student will be attending during the first semester of the freshman year of college. For subsequent years the student must submit all of the above documentation along with prior year's grade report (unofficial grade report will suffice). Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email. *Please keep us advised of your current email address.*

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to maintain full-time student status with a cumulative 3.0 grade point average.
