



Robert and Patricia Endries Family Scholarships

Lifelong residents of the Brillion area, Bob and Pat Endries founded their business in the basement of their home in 1970. Thirty six years saw Endries International expand to 550 employees with 70 locations in the United States and 6 countries. With the sale of the Endries' enterprise in 2006, Bob and Pat's time was freed up to give back to their community. One of the ways they did so was through the Endries Family Scholarship Programs for students from Brillion High School, alma mater of both Bob and Pat. These scholarships are awarded to students who have demonstrated outstanding leadership, academic excellence and responsible citizenship in the Brillion High School community who look to pursue higher education.

Eligibility:

Graduating high school seniors from Brillion High School who are planning to pursue post-secondary education.

Award Amount:

Two \$1,000 per year renewable scholarship awards for up to four years (total \$4,000) to full time students attending a four-year college or university who maintain a 2.5 minimum GPA.

One \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship award for a full time student to attend any college, university or technical college.

One \$1,000 non-renewable Community Service Scholarship award for a full time student to attend any college, university or technical college.

Selection:

Recipients are selected each spring by the Brillion High School Scholarship Selection Committee. One of the two renewable awards will be preferential for a student planning to attend a private college; the other can be awarded to a student planning to attend any four-year college or university.

The \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship award will be based primarily on financial need in order to attend any college, university or technical college.

The \$1,000 non-renewable Community Service Scholarship award will be based on a student that has demonstrated outstanding leadership in service to their community and neighbors.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: completed scholarship verification form (located at www.cffoxvalley.org/scholarships) and verification of full time student status (class schedule with credits listed). For scholarships that are renewable, each year the student must submit all of the above documentation along with prior year's grade report (unofficial grade report will suffice). After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending during the first semester. Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email; please keep us advised of your current email address.

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to maintain full time student status with a minimum 2.5 grade point average each year.
