



Megan Short Memorial Scholarship

In April 2008, Megan Short's family established this scholarship in her memory. Megan was a 2003 graduate of Bonduel High School and attended UW Green Bay. She was a kind, gentle and caring individual who lost her battle to brain cancer in July of 2007. She loved school, her horses, her dog and the little neighbor children. The Short family set up this scholarship to benefit students continuing their education in the medical field which includes doctor, nurse, nursing assistant, physical therapy and rehabilitative care specialist with the hope that the recipient will make a difference in the lives of others.

"The true worth of your travels lies not in where you come to be at journey's end, but the lives you touch along the way." This was a quote that Megan tried to live her life by and strongly believed in.



Eligibility:

Graduating seniors from Bonduel High School who are planning to obtain post-secondary education in the medical field at an accredited college, university or technical college. The candidates will have demonstrated:

- Academic achievement with a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA
- Strong work ethic
- Motivated and diverse in their activities
- Community minded
- Compassion for others, kind, caring and a humanitarian

Award Amount:

One \$500 non-renewable scholarship award for tuition expenses.

Selection:

Recipients will be selected each spring by Bonduel High School Scholarship Selection Committee.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: completed scholarship verification form (located at <u>www.cffoxvalley.org/scholarships</u>), grade transcripts from the first semester of the first year of college with a minimum 3.0 GPA, verification of full time student status for the second semester of college (class schedule with credits listed), and proof of a medical field major. After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending during the second semester of the freshman year of college. This scholarship cannot be deferred. Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email. *Please keep us advised of your current email address.*

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to complete the first semester of post-secondary education with a 3.0 GPA or "B" average and register as a full time student in a medical field for the second semester of college.
