Eligibility:

Graduating seniors from Bonduel High School who are planning to pursue a degree, technical diploma, or certificate program (e.g. nursing assistant, medical assistant, or technician) in a medical or healthcare field, and attending a 2- or 4-year college, university or technical school.

Award Amount:

One \$500 non-renewable scholarship award for tuition expenses

Selection:

Recipients will be selected each spring by Bonduel High School Scholarship Selection Committee.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: completed scholarship verification form (located at www.cfoxvalley.org/scholarships), verification of full time student (class schedule with credits listed) and proof of major. After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending during the first semester of the freshman year of college. This scholarship cannot be deferred. Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email. **Please keep us advised of your current email address.**

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to register as a full-time student with a career goal in a medical or healthcare profession.
