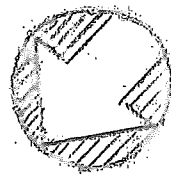
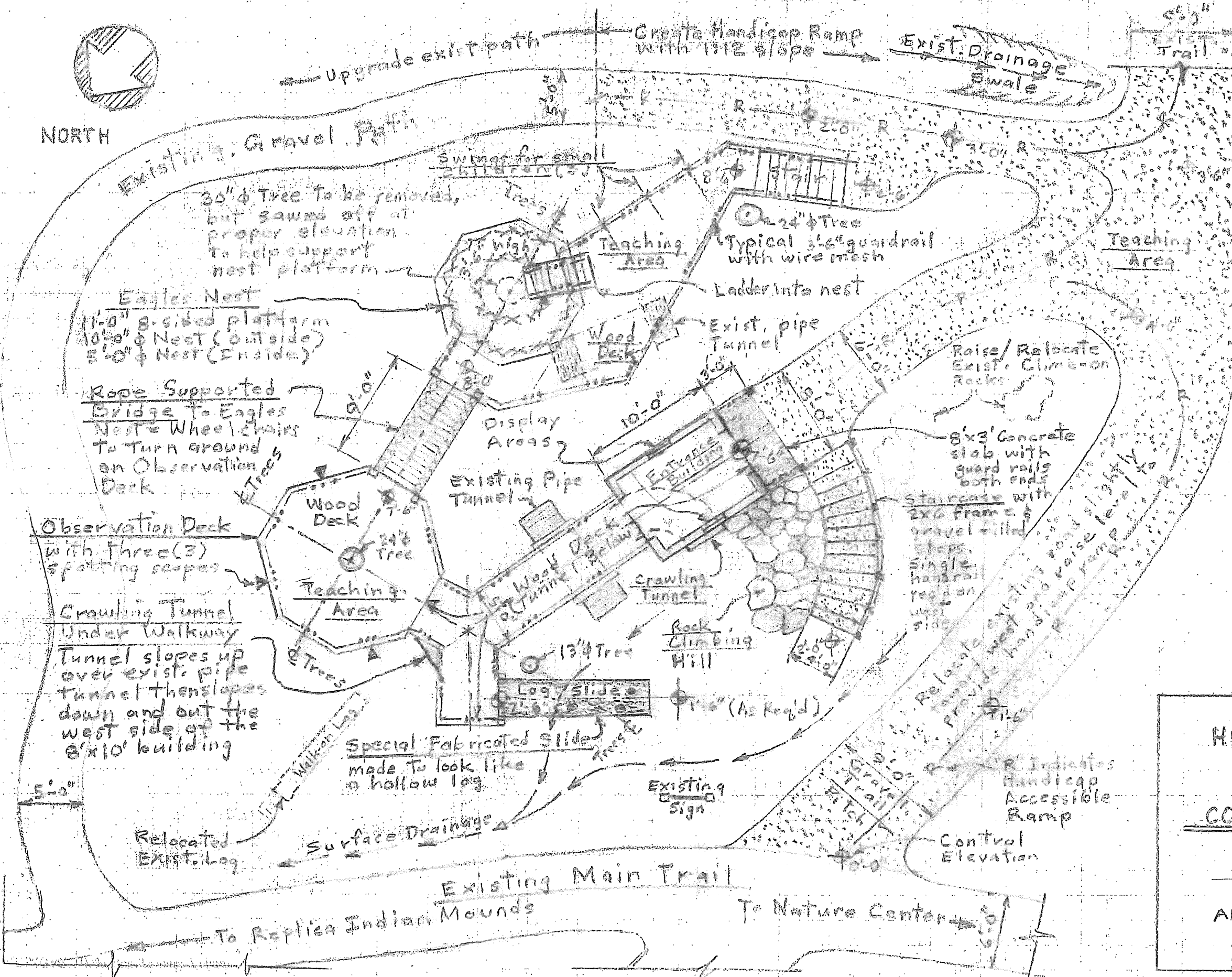


Looking for Hearts

Bottom of roof joists

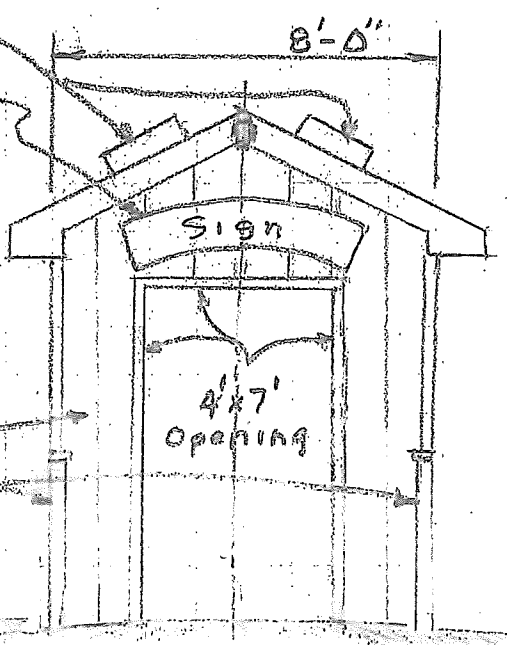
1/2" Exterior Paneling (Painted)

El. 7'6"

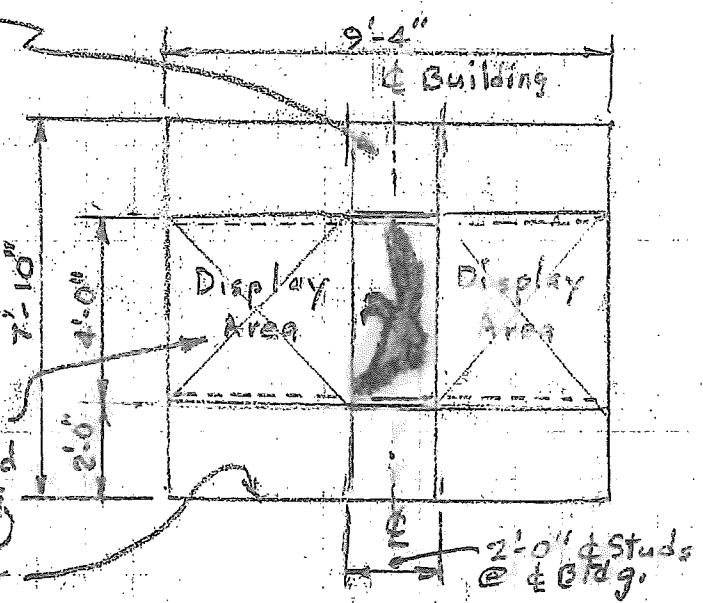
Top Wood decking & Concrete slab (3'-wide x width of Bldg.)

1/4" = 1'-0" (Looking North)

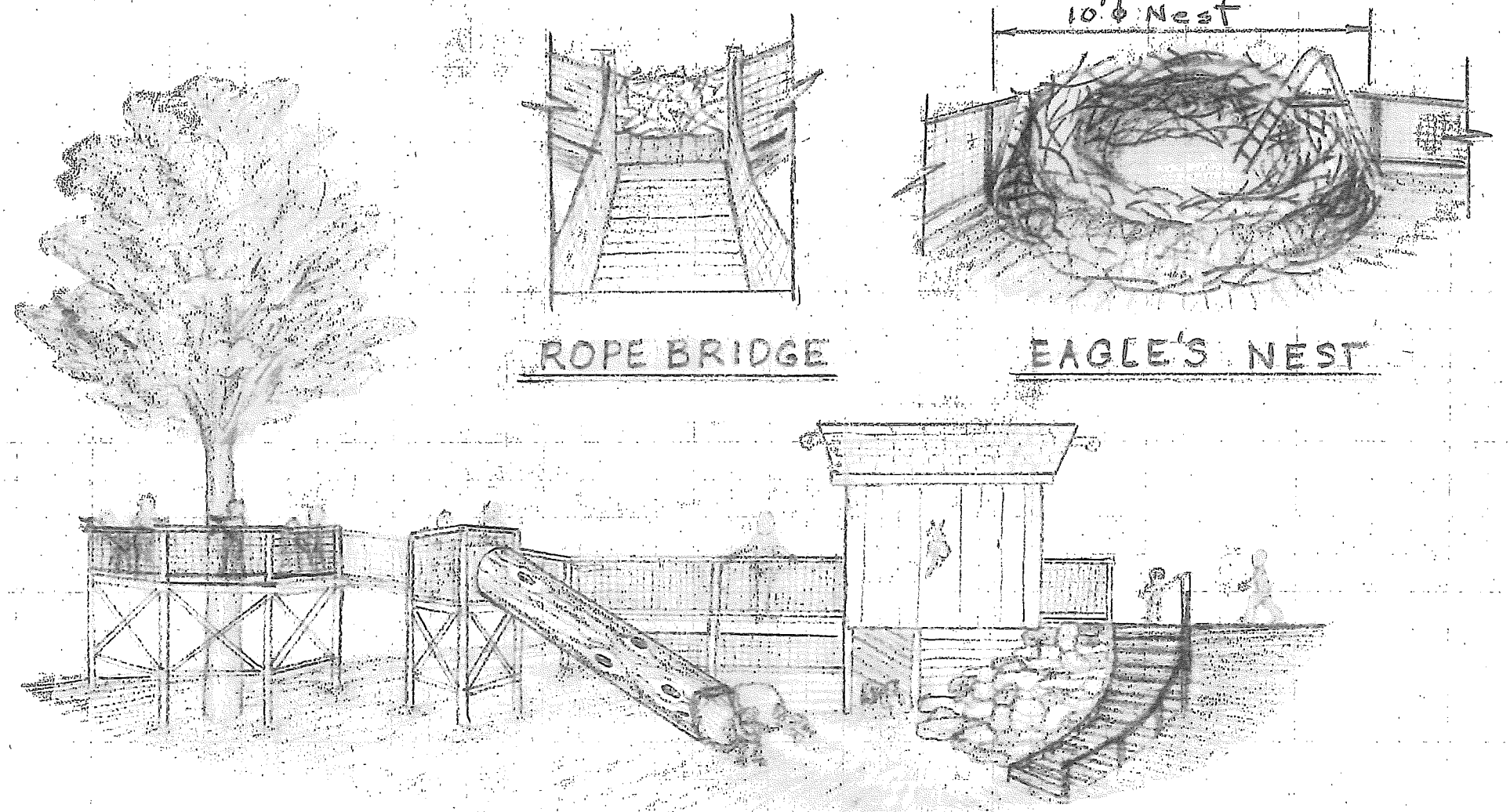
2'-0" x 8'-0" x 1/2" exterior plywood (Outside) with animal/bird cut-out window. A flying eagle is shown as view through eagle cut-out is the Eagle's Nest.

1/2" exterior plywood (2'-0" high) all around inside for mounting displays (painted)
Wood Deck Floor

FIRST LOOK - THROUGH THE EYES OF A CHILD

After a short walk from the Nature Center through a wooded wetland, my "First look" at the area where the program was to be taught looked really cool. Sliding through a Hollow Log looked like fun. I noticed the entrances to two Crawling Tunnels, and I saw a Hill of rocks to Climb On. Then the naturalist leader invited us to walk up the Handicapped Accessible Ramp to a gathering area in front of an Entrance Building. I began learning about plants, animals and birds.

As I passed through the Entrance Building to get to the Observation Deck, I thought about taking a closer look at the Displays later. The Observation Deck had three Spotting Scopes to use to find animal and bird silhouettes hidden in the woods - and there were possibilities for seeing wild deer, turkeys and other critters.

Then, I ascended (up a one-foot rise) on a Rope Suspended Bridge to an Eagle's Nest where I got to learn more about birds. It's a nest nest! Looking down on the world from the deck level, I saw a lot of things to discover and do. Let the Play Time begin!
