

A dementia-friendly facility meets the changing need of people diagnosed with dementia along with their care partners and friends. It is an opportunity to overcome the stigma and isolation experienced by many with dementia. Chilton Public Library was awarded a \$1,790 grant from CACF as they become a more dementia-friendly library. The money will create themed "reminisce" kits that can be shared between friends/care partners and people with memory loss. Themes include farming, sewing, gardening, cooking and more. Kits may include books, simple hand-eye coordination games, DVDs, CDs and other memory-provoking articles.

Mural projects transform Chilton, Stockbridge

A Wisconsin artist and a team of assistants created two gigantic downtown murals in Calumet County in the summer, turning the communities of Chilton and Stockbridge into a showcase of beauty and history. Calumet County Historical Society used a \$5,000 grant from CACF to help fund a mural on Main Street, Chilton, depicting Chilton's founders. James Barany, an historian and art professor at Milwaukee Institute of Art and Design, researched, designed and painted the mural with the assistants. The Calumet County Mural Project not only increases access and visibility to the arts and local history, it includes an important educational component in the school districts that will help students understand how to foster art and history in their own lives. The murals will truly enhance Chilton's outdoor artistic environment for years to come.
