



Quentin and Ermagard Kuenzli Family Scholarship

The Quentin and Ermagard Kuenzli Family Scholarship was established by Ermagard Kuenzli in memory of her husband, Quentin Kuenzli. In his 90 years of life, Quentin was a very successful public accountant and a tremendous asset to his community.

Quentin graduated from the University of Wisconsin, Madison, earning a degree in accounting and then passed his CPA exam. He was awarded the Bronze Star for conspicuous gallantry in action during his service as a Warrant Officer for the U.S. Army in World War II.

In 1944 Quentin was united in marriage to Ermagard Holtz. They were blessed with two daughters and three grandchildren during their 63 years of marriage.

Quentin was a Senior Partner with Schenck, S.C. in Appleton for many years, and a member of local, state and national certified public accountant organizations. Quentin was active with many civic and fraternal organizations and served on the board of directors for The Salvation Army, Kiwanis Club, Riverside Cemetery, First Congregational United Church of Christ, Peabody Manor (20 years), and The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (50 years).

Quentin would join Ermagard and their daughters, Anlouise and Mary Lou, in proudly knowing that this scholarship will provide support to students pursuing a career in accounting for generations to come.

Eligibility:

Graduating seniors of public and private high schools in Appleton, Hortonville, Kaukauna, Kimberly, Little Chute, Neenah, Menasha, and DeForest, WI, who are pursuing a degree in accounting; either an associate degree at a technical college located within Wisconsin, or a bachelor's degree at any accredited college or university. The following will be taken into consideration during the selection process:

- Academic achievement (minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA for those seeking an associate degree or 3.5 GPA for those seeking a bachelor's degree)
- Extracurricular and volunteer activities / Work history / Financial need
- Special consideration may be given to family members of former employees or retirees of Schenck, S.C., and to family members of U.S. military service members or veterans.

Award Amount:

Up to three renewable scholarships for tuition expenses for students attending a 4-year school. The scholarship will be paid at the rate of \$1,000 for the freshman year, \$2,000 for the sophomore year, \$3,500 for the junior year, and \$5,000 for the senior year, for a **total award up to \$11,500**.

Up to one renewable scholarship for tuition expenses for students attending a 2-year technical school. The scholarship will be paid at a rate of \$1,000 for the freshman and sophomore years, for a **total award up to \$2,000**.

Selection:

Recipients are selected each spring by the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region, Inc. selection committee.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after submission of the following to the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region: Completed scholarship verification form (located at www.cffoxvalley.org/scholarships), verification of full time student status (class schedule with credits listed) and proof of major. For subsequent years the student must submit all of the above documentation, along with prior year's grade report (unofficial grade report will suffice). After approval of submitted documentation, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending during the first semester. Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email; **please keep us advised of your current email address**.

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to maintain full-time student status while pursuing a degree in accounting, with a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA for a bachelor's degree or 2.5 GPA for an associate degree. Students pursuing an associate degree must attend a technical school within the State of Wisconsin.
