



SECURA All-College Scholarship

SECURA All-College Scholarships are awarded exclusively to eligible dependents of SECURA's non-officer associates who have been employed for at least one year. The program began with scholarships awarded in 1989 and has continued to award scholarships each year thereafter.

Eligibility:

Dependent children of SECURA's non-executive associates who are planning to pursue an associate's or undergraduate degree from an accredited college or university. This scholarship is typically awarded to high school seniors, however, juniors entering college on Early Admission status will also be considered. The ideal recipient will have demonstrated:

- Leadership qualities
- Participation in extracurricular activities, including volunteering
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Preference may be given to students planning to pursue a business-related degree

Award Amount:

Up to three \$2,000 per year renewable scholarship awards (up to four years: total \$8,000) for tuition, payable in the fall semester. If a student completes an associate degree and immediately transfers (no break in service) to a four-year college for a bachelor's degree, the student will continue to receive the scholarship funds for up to four years.

Selection:

Recipients are selected each spring by the Community Foundation Scholarship Selection Committee.

Payment Procedure:

Scholarship payments will be released after your submission and approval from Community Foundation staff of the online scholarship verification form. Log in to your account on the Community Foundation Web Portal at <https://donor.cffoxvalley.org/SpectrumWebPortal>. Click on Scholarship Applicant, then My Awards. Select the Scholarship Name and then on Follow-up Action, Scholarship Verification Form, towards the bottom of the page. Complete, save and submit the form. The scholarship check will be paid directly to the school you will be attending during the first semester. Repeat the process for subsequent payments. Most communications between the Community Foundation and the student will be via email. **Please keep us advised of your current email address.**

Loss of Eligibility:

Students must maintain full-time student status at an accredited college or university, pursuing an associate's or undergraduate degree, with a minimum 3.0 GPA each year in order to be eligible for renewal of the scholarship award.
