



## Robert and Patricia Endries Family Scholarships

### Background:

Lifelong residents of the Brillion area, Bob and Pat Endries founded their business in the basement of their home in 1970. Thirty-six years saw Endries International expand to 550 employees with 70 locations in the United States and 6 countries. With the sale of the Endries' enterprise in 2006, Bob and Pat's time was freed up to give back to their community. One of the ways they did so was through the Endries Family Scholarship Programs for students from Brillion High School, alma mater of both Bob and Pat. These scholarships are awarded to students who have demonstrated outstanding leadership, academic excellence and responsible citizenship in the Brillion High School community who look to pursue higher education.



### Eligibility: (taken into consideration to determine recipients)

- Graduating high school seniors from Brillion High School
- Planning to attend a college, university, or technical school

### Award Amount:

- Two \$1,000 per year renewable scholarship awards for up to four years (total \$4,000) to full-time students attending a 4-year college or university, with a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA.
- One \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship award for a full-time student to attend any college, university, or technical college.
- One \$1,000 non-renewable Community Service Scholarship award for a full-time student to attend any college, university, or technical college.

### Selection:

Recipients are recommended each spring by the Brillion High School Scholarship Selection Committee.

- One of the two renewable awards will be preferential for a student planning to attend a private college; the other can be awarded to a student planning to attend any four-year college or university.
- The \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship award will be based primarily on financial need in order to attend any college, university or technical college.
- The \$1,000 non-renewable Community Service Scholarship award will be based on a student that has demonstrated outstanding leadership in service to their community and neighbors.

### Collecting the Award & Payment Procedure:

Recipients must fill out and submit Scholarship Acceptance Form and Scholarship Verification Form through the [Scholarship Portal](https://www.grantinterface.com/Home/Logon?urlkey=cffvrscholar) (<https://www.grantinterface.com/Home/Logon?urlkey=cffvrscholar>). Recipients are required to provide supporting documents *as instructed* in the Scholarship Verification Form, such as class registration/list **with** credits listed, proof of major, grade transcript, etc.

After approval of online Scholarship Verification Form, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending. The **Community Foundation communicates with students via email**; it is the student's responsibility to keep their Scholarship Portal account updated with their current email address.

### Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to maintain full-time student status at a college, university, or technical school with a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA.
