



Clintonville Area Foundation Darrell Wolf Trades Scholarship

Background:

This scholarship was established in honor of Darrell Wolf, a 1982 graduate of Marion High School. Darrell's talent was in working with metals. He was a self-taught machinist creating parts for equipment on the family farm. Using a milling machine, lathe, and other tools he created finely detailed limited edition scale models of tractors long before computers existed. The intent of this scholarship is to support students in their journey to learning to work with machines.

Eligibility: (taken into consideration to determine recipients)

- Individuals residing in the Marion or Clintonville School Districts
- Planning to attend an accredited 2-year technical college as a part-time or full-time student
- Planning to or pursuing a degree in welding or machining
- Preference given to students who participated in Youth Apprenticeship Program and/or employment in a related industry
- Financial need will be considered

Award Amount:

One \$500 non-renewable scholarship award to be used for cost of attendance for the first semester of college.

Selection:

Recipients will be recommended each spring by the Community Foundation's Scholarship Selection Committee.

Collecting the Award & Payment Procedure:

Recipients must fill out and submit Scholarship Acceptance Form and Scholarship Verification Form through the <u>Scholarship Portal</u> (https://www.grantinterface.com/Home/Logon?urlkey=cffvrscholar). Recipients are required to provide supporting documents *as instructed* in the Scholarship Verification Form, such as class registration/list **with** credits listed, proof of major, grade transcript, etc.

After approval of online Scholarship Verification Form, the scholarship check will be paid directly to the school the recipient will be attending. The **Community Foundation communicates with students via email**; it is the student's responsibility to keep their Scholarship Portal account updated with their current email address.

Loss of Eligibility:

Failure to register as a part-time or full-time student pursuing a degree in welding or machining at an accredited 2-year technical college.
